

Mom's Report

As usual Iowa State resumed classes in January following Christmas break. What was not usual was the pipe in the Fire Sprinkler System that froze and broke between the 2nd and 3rd floor on the NW side of the house. This happened on Christmas day, so of course no one was here. The Ames Fire Department came to the house and shut off the water. Unfortunately, there was damage to walls, floors, and ceilings in that part of the house. Alumni Carl Hansen facilitated the drying out of damaged area, the repair and replacement of walls, ceilings and floors. He worked with Service Master, Story County Construction and Carpet One. It took a while but the damage has been repaired and the house looks really good again. That same weekend there were several other houses in the Greek Community and homes in the Ames area that also had frozen pipes.

While the repairs were in process 201 Gray continued pretty much as usual. The new executive team assumed their leadership positions in the house, men attended classes, studied, participated in clubs and committees, and went to basketball games. Members also attended leadership and recruitment trainings in Kansas City, and Lip Sync practice at the fraternity was held 3 nights a week.
